EXTREM WINTER PACKAGES

January - February - March 2009

BASE ON 2 CUSTOMERS

Day 1 Travel with Air Inuit

- Departure from Montreal to Puvirnituq via Air Inuit and arrival early afternoon.
- Transfer to hotel in Puvirnitug
- Room allocation at Puvirnituq Hotel (3Stars)(double occupancy)
- Welcome cocktail and country food light lunch
- Puvirnitug Mayor welcome speech
- Meeting for detail security procedures and general information on activity programs.
- Return to Puvirnitug hotel
- Dinner at hotel (traditional or non traditional meals)
- Night at Puvirnitug hotel.


Day 2 Travel by dog teams.

By dog team you will explore Puvirnituq region. Will have tea break and with your guides / instructors you will build your igloos for the night. You will be going in the past and enjoy your evening and night. The evening will be full of surprise with Katajaq (throat singers) and some real stories from your guides/ instructors. If the sky is clear you may see some northern lights.



Breakfast at hotel

- Introduction to dog team and Musher's
- Ride the dog team around the village (Puvirnituq Lake, Puvirnituq Bay or Hudson Bay shore)
- o Lunch (traditional or non traditional meals) in land
- Return to the village
- Diner at hotel (traditional meals)
- Traditional evening (igloo)
- Inuit Throat singers (Katajaq)
- Night in Igloo



Day 3, 4, Travel by dog teams.

By dog team you will travel to Akulivik region and Smith Island. You will have tea break and with your guides / instructors you will build your igloos for the night. You will be going in the past and enjoy your evening and night with some real stories from your guides / instructors. If the sky is clear you may see some northern lights.

- Breakfast in igloo
- Ride the dog team to Akulivik region and to smith Island
- Lunch (traditional or non traditional meals) in land
- Build Igloo
- Supper (traditional or non traditional meals) in land
- Night in Igloo or Hotel in Akulivik

Day 5 Nights in Akulivik

- Breakfast in igloo or hotel
- Morning off
- Meeting with Akulivik Mayor and visit the local stores
- Supper at the hotel (traditional or non traditional meals)
- Overnight at the hotel

Day 6 Travel back to Puvirnituq by dog teams



Day 7 Travel back to Puvirnituq by dog teams

- Supper at the hotel (traditional or non traditional meals)
- Overnight at the hotel

Day 8 Travel with Air Inuit

- Breakfast at hotel
- o Prepare for departure location (Montreal)
- Lunch at hotel
- Departure from Puvirnituq to Montreal via Air Inuit and evening arrival.
- Night at hotel (Montreal)

Day 9 Bad weather day spare

- Dog team
- Snowmachine (support)
- Guides / Instructors (one guide / instructor per 2 customers)

CONDITIONS

Theses extremes treks are physically demanding, it is imperative that whatever the age of participants, they be in good health, self-reliant, and of flexible attitude. The Arctic is both undependable and unforgiving. Trying to force things to happen in order to maintain a preset schedule will accomplish nothing, but will only create frustrations for everyone. These are the conditions of Arctic travel, past as well as present. In this regard, the preceding itinerary is intended as a general guide. The departure dates could change, variables beyond our control, such as the weather or sea ice conditions, could force modification of the itinerary, including the elimination of planned trip elements. The day we travel to Akulivik will be chosen based on a high probability for success. On these days, your guides will make sure you travel safely, however, they will not take unnecessary risks; in the event of a failed attempt, no refunds are possible. Accordingly, if the ability to kickback and be patient is alien to your philosophy, it is suggested that participation would be a mistake; delays are inevitable.

Price is inclusive, per person, double occupancy, and based on 2 paying participants. Single supplements are not normally available in the Arctic; however, single participants are not required to pay a surcharge. Price is subject to change as conditioned by such variables as the number of participants, fuel costs, and a surcharge of \$550 cdn to partially cover the cost of additional nights that may be spent at the Nunavik's Hotel in excess of the five nights provided for in this itinerary. (In the 8 years that we have made these geographic packages, there have been few instances where one additional night was required.)

The additional cost is necessary due to the extremely high costs associated with such remote accommodations. The alternative to these charges is to arbitrarily increase the cost of the basic trip to provide for such potential contingencies.

The cost of this package is base on 2 customers.

Travel south with Air Inuit from any Nunavik Village

Maximum 42 kg plus one carry on
